Mayor Michael Bloomberg's congestion pricing plan got a boost yesterday when state lawmakers overwhelmingly approved a study of the proposal, but significant political and practical hurdles remain before New York becomes the first U.S. city to charge motorists to drive in its central business district.

"This is just a study bill," said Sen. Owen Johnson (R-West Babylon), in explaining why he supported the creation of a 17-member traffic commission that will report back to the legislature in March. "It's good to investigate. The real vote is next year."
