## A Public Service from Keep NYC Congestion Tax Free:

The public ought to know that the 13-member Commission on Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) Financing, established by Governor David Paterson earlier this year and chaired by former MTA Chairman Richard Ravitch, has four public meetings beginning September 15. The "Ravitch Commission" as it is known, "is charged with recommending strategies to fund MTA capital projects and operating needs over the next ten years," according to the Governor's statement. Interestingly it has a deadline after this November's election: December 5, 2008. Many alternative revenues would resource mass transit without screwing hard working working and middle class New Yorkers.

The tentative meeting dates — **September 15** (Manhattan), **September 22** (Nassau County), and **September 24** (Westchester) — provide **NO** opportunities for residents of four NYC boroughs (Brooklyn, Queens, Staten Island and The Bronx) and two suburban counties (Rockland and Suffolk) the MTA serves. This needs to change.
