## <u>Tolling Free Bridges = Unfair, Inefficient, Economy-killing</u>

It makes no sense to impose Tolls on <u>Free</u> East River and Harlem River Bridges – <u>especially as we endure a severe recession bordering on a depression</u>.

## Tolls kill the economy:

- → For every lost driver entering Manhattan, the city loses Economic Activity, Taxes and Jobs.
- For every 28,000 fewer cars we will lose:
  - As much as \$2.7 billion overall reduction in economic activity in the City.
  - o Tolls kill jobs (more than 25,000)
  - o Tolls kill State and City tax revenues. As much as \$250 million.
- → In this period of severe economic crisis we can't afford to lose one car!

## Tolls on Free Bridges Will Harm the Boroughs Outside Manhattan

- → Regressive Tolls disproportionately hits the pockets of middle-class and working New Yorkers largely from the Bronx, Brooklyn, and Queens who use the Free Bridges.
- → City residents would pay 78%. Non-City residents would only pay 22%.

## \$2 tolls would generate NO funds for transit! Instead, it means a net revenue loss and new annual costs.

<b>Costs incurred by tolling free bridges</b> (updated 2-26-2009)	Annual Cost (\$ millions)
Bridge maintenance and debt service/ collecting tolls via E-ZPass and Photos	-\$400
Annual Decline in projected tax revenue	-\$80 to \$250
From that deduct the revenue raised by a \$2 toll	\$400
→ NET <u>LOSS</u> OF TOLLING OUR FREE BRIDGES	-\$80 to -\$250

Keep NYC Free's revenue plan looks even better against the unfair/inequitable toll-tax reliant Ravitch scheme.
