The MTA holds its next Board Meeting, Wednesday, November 30, 2022, at 10:00 a.m. It important that we build on the success of our efforts and now press the MTA to agree to an <u>INDEPENDENT AUDIT</u> of its finances. We can also press the need for a <u>Full Environmental Impact Statement</u> in place of a much more limited Environment Assessment.

The MTA <u>website</u> states, "Those who wish to speak at the <u>10:00 a.m.</u> board meeting need to register, either <u>online</u> or <u>in person</u>, at its 2 Broadway headquarters in lower Manhattan. <u>The registration window (on line and at the 2 Broadway meeting room)</u> opens 35 minutes before the beginning of the <u>Board meeting and closes 5 minutes before it begins.</u>

Check back <u>here</u> on the Wednesday, November 30, 2022, meeting date to access the online registration form. Once you have registered to provide live remote comments, you will receive an e-mail with instructions on how to access the meeting's remote public comment virtual session.

According to the MTA, "The Board meeting includes up to 60 minutes of inperson and remote comments combined. Registered speakers beyond that time frame are invited to separately record their comments. All comments are delivered to the MTA Board and posted online. Statements must be about agenda items only. There is a two-minute speaking limit, and speaking time may not be transferred."
